Lacock Thursday 28th April 2016



If there is ever a 'must visit' place it has to be Lacock village & Abbey, a lively National Trust property in Wiltshire. The ancient buildings are quite breathtaking. The village also featured the 1995 version of "Pride and Prejudice" and the 2008 "The Other Boleyn Girl", and T.V. dramas include "Larkrise to Candleford". The Fox Talbot museum is an interesting place to tour as it is also where the first film negative from a camera was made. A walk around the village is a world of old cottages going back hundreds of years. Take a good look around the grounds and be sure to see the botanic gardens. There are shops and places to eat around the picturesque village. There is a lot to see. Take your camera.

Forde Abbey Monday 23rd May

Forde Abbey in Dorset is a treasure in an area already known for its outstanding beauty. It is a family home as well as a living and breathing working estate, and welcomes visitors all year round. Bird Group Outing, Llanelli

Thursday 14th January 2016



We set out from Cardiff on a dreary, rainy morning, which did not augur well for our birdwatching day out. However, on arrival, the rain stopped and did not return, and the skies stayed brighter for the rest of the day.

Ten of us gathered in the coffee shop at about 10 o'clock (Don & Janet Ribeiro, Lin & Frank Learner, Sian Jones & Helen Wynne with their friend Pat, Andy & Marion Mardell, and Anne German). From there we watched the nearby feeders. By 10.30 we had already seen 17 species. Tits and finches were in the majority. The highlights were a pair of greenfinches, a song thrush, a jay, a spritely wren and a (briefly seen) sparrowhawk.

After coffee we made our way, to the Michael Powell and British Steel Hides to see what was present on the scrapes. Numerous lapwing were present here intermingled with some redshank and a kingfisher did two flypasts at high speed.

After an enjoyable lunch break we moved on to the Heron and Peter Scott Hides looking for more ducks and waders. A little Grebe was seen intermittently as it repeatedly dived under the water. We also saw a goodly number of shovelers, a goldcrest in the shrubs on the bank and four rather sleepy snipe.

On our way out we watched the nearby feeders and added another five species including nuthatch and a great spotted woodpecker to our tally.

Altogether we saw 42 different species not including the curlew which we heard but nobody saw.

A very successful day out.
