Central office has kept in touch either by e-mail or post with their regular newsletters.



## Outlined below are the Income and Expenditure figures for 2020 - 2021



The above figures for the financial year 2020 – 2021 (subject to final auditor's report) are very different to our normal "trading" year.

There is marked difference in membership fees, donations, fund raising activity etc.

## Membership Fees 2021 – 2022

To maintain viability of the branch, membership fees will be due from April 2021.

To maintain our current balance the membership fee this year has been reduced to £10.
