# **Future of the NHS Retirement Fellowship**

As you may be aware the future of the NHSRF is in doubt due to a lack of funding from *Health Education* in England and the *Welsh Government* here in Wales. If the Fellowship is to continue in its current format alternative funding will be required and inevitably this will fall to the branches and, therefore, the membership to provide.

### So what is proposed?

All members on the database will receive a newsletter from Central Office of NHSRF at some time in January 2017 containing information to help them make an informed choice regarding the future of the NHSRF. Furthermore it will detail the impact on branches if the Fellowship ceases to exist. The newsletter will also contain a ballot paper to be returned by individual members to vote on their preference of the two options, which broadly speaking will be:

**Option 1.** To agree to an increase in capitation fees from £5 to £20 per member from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2017. Or

**Option 2.** To agree that a capitation fee increase of this magnitude is not desirable. (The actual wording of the voting options has not yet been decided).

## What are the possible implications?

If the outcome of the ballot shows that the membership agree the Fellowship should continue **with** an increase in the capitation fee Central Office will take £20 for every member on our register from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2017. This means that our branch fees will need to increase from the current £15 per year. The branch committee will then determine the level of the membership fee for 2017/18. It has been suggested that initially we might consider raising the individual fee to £25 per year with a joint membership of £40 and that one member is 'silent' meaning that only one capitation fee is paid. The fee increase could initially be supported from existing branch funds.

## Alternatively

If the outcome of the ballot shows that the membership reject the increase in the capitation fee Central Office will begin the process of closure of the NHSRF. We as a branch will need to consider what the impact will be for us. Initially all the funds in the branch current account will be returned to the Central Office of NHSRF.

- \* Without capitation fee can we still exist in a similar format? [Yes!]
- \* Will we continue to attract new members if our link to the NHSRF no longer exists? [Yes!]

There will probably be no initial increase in our annual membership fee in the NHS Retirement Fellowship.

## Steart Marshes (Bridgewater, Som.)

After a later than planned start, Don arrived at the site car park about 10.30, with Anne and David and met David's son, Greg, who spent a couple of hours with us. The day was dry with a cool breeze and after visiting the first hide we met Elaine and Peter and soon after, Sue and Mike, making our total eight.

We saw about 100 Lapwing, many Shellduck, some Heron, Egret, Cormorant, Wigeon and Teal. About 40-50 Golden Plovers were



looking splendid in their winter plumage. There was some Grey Plovers and some saw a Kingfisher. The landscape was enhanced by Highland cattle and occasional watery sunshine.





The raptors spotted were Kestrel, Buzzard and a Male Marsh Harrier. The hides were state-of-the-art, Double-glazed windows and lined inside with plywood, making them warm on a cold day. Three main hides are fairly close together but paths lead off to more remote areas where, the sightings

board revealed, someone saw a Giant Egret.

There were a surprising number of Stonechats around the paths, a Reed Bunting was seen and a group of seven Skylarks. Small flocks of Goldfinch and a linnet were also noted plus the usual Titmice and Sparrows.




After our lunch on the hoof we went our separate ways starting for home around 2.30pm.
