## **Future of the NHS Retirement Fellowship**

#### The story so far

Capitation fees have remained at a nominal amount until 2012 when they were increased to £5 and more recently in 2015 to £10.

The Fellowship previously received annual grants but these have been withheld.

The only way that the Fellowship can continue is to be self sufficient and therefore to achieve this aim there would need to be an increase in the current capitation fee from £10 to £20 per member.

**The result of the ballot** which closed on March 10<sup>th</sup> was as follows:

Number of votes cast	8,345
Number of votes in favour of raising the capitation subscription	6,746
Number of votes against the proposal was	1,217
Spoilt papers 382	
Votes cast approximately 75% of the membership (12,000+)	

### What happens next?

At branch level we have to, regretfully, increase our membership fee to reflect the increase in capitation fee thus:

Subscription fee April 2017 – March 2018: Single £25 Joint £40

At national level a strategic plan will be developed to allow efficient running of the Fellowship from the capitation fee alone i.e. become self sufficient.

Before the end of this month (March) there will be National Council and Board of Trustee Meetings. A follow up statement will be issued.

There is an All Wales Liaison Committee meeting on Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> March when John Rostill (Chief Executive of the Fellowship) will be present.

## Tetbury & Highgrove Gardens Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> May



**Tetbury** is proud of its recorded history since 681 when Tetta's Monastery was mentioned in a charter by King Ethelred of Mercia and was an important Wool Trade town in the Middle Ages.

Tetbury has a wonderful variety of shops including 25 antique shops, many specialist shops, a wide choice of tea rooms, bistros, cafes, pubs and restaurants which offer a good choice of food and drink.

#### Highgrove Gardens

Immediately prior to His Royal Highness's arrival, Highgrove was the home of Maurice Macmillan whose father, Harold Macmillan, was the British Prime Minister in the late Nineteen-Fifties and early Sixties.

Since 1980, both the house and the gardens have been the subject of many thoughtful and innovative changes. When the Prince first arrived, Highgrove possessed little more than a neglected kitchen garden, an overgrown copse, some pastureland and a few hollow oaks.

Today, after the hard work of scores of people, the garden unfolds in a series of highly personable and inspiring tableaux, each one reflecting the Prince's interests and enthusiasm.




## **Person** For organizing Theatre/Concert outings
